

Maryland Concealed Carry (Wear & Carry)/Handgun Qualification

License Prohibiting Factors

(Please Answer the below questions by initialing next to the relevant corresponding answer)

1. Examples of prohibiting offenses include, but are not limited to: assault, battery, resisting arrest, obstructing and hindering a police officer, drug offenses, weapons offenses, and theft offenses. These are only examples; there are other prohibiting offenses. If you are unsure of the maximum penalty under Maryland law for the offense of which you were convicted, stop and research prior to continuing.

2. Have you ever been convicted of a crime of violence? (The term “crime of violence” means, abduction; arson, in the first degree; assault in the first or second degree; burglary in the first, second, or third degree; carjacking and armed carjacking; escape in the first degree; kidnapping; voluntary manslaughter, maiming as previously prohibited under article 27, 386 of the Code; mayhem as previously prohibited under former Article 27, 384 of the Code; murder in the first or second degree; rape in the first or second degree; robbery; robbery with a dangerous weapon; sexual offense in the first, second, or third degree; an attempt to commit any of the crimes listed above; or assault with intent to commit any of the crimes listed above or assault with intent to commit a crime punishable by imprisonment for more than 1 year?

3. Have you every received probation before judgment (PBJ) for a crime of violence? This does not apply to PBJ for assault in the second degree or to an expunged PBJ.)
